Conditional use permit to construct a cellular tower at McLoughlin Elementary School

This is the official position of the Hazel Grove Westling Farms Neighborhood Association.

The Hazel Grove Westling Farms Neighborhood Association has been strongly opposed to the proposed location since we first learned of it. Although some members of our Neighborhood Association are also customers of AT&T, even they have stated placement of a tower at the school is not in the best interest and safety of the children.

Many of us would very much like to see improved coverage from AT&T and some have stated that they switched providers in order to achieve cell phone coverage. The majority however feel that AT&T has not considered alternate locations to achieve their goal of improved coverage.

We invited Ted Thonstad, Director of Operations for the School District to attend our January 16, 2014 meeting. He explained what the district had in mind and much discussion followed. Two individuals, both of whom identified themselves as officers of the John McLoughlin PTSO, spoke against the proposal. A vote was taken. There were 4 votes in favor of the tower, 25 votes against the tower and 5 abstentions. Mr. Thonstad passed out a document that he had prepared, which was designed to answer questions that we might have.

That document states, quote "Is the cellular tower tree installation a 'done deal'?

No. Before a decision can be made, AT&T must determine if the possible location is suitable for a cellular tower tree. On Friday, November 22nd AT&T will send out a crew to further evaluate the site.

If AT&T wants to move forward, the next step would be to allow time to hear from our community. While a public meeting is not required, Oregon City School District is discussing this matter with McLoughlin School families, the PTA and inviting anyone that has a comment to share it at the January 13, 2014 School Board Meeting."

Note that this was given to us on January 16th, three days after the School Board Meeting. See Exhibit B for details

Mr. Thonstad heard our concerns and was present when our vote was taken on January 16, 2014. The school district went forward and signed a contract with AT&T on March 13, 2014. It was accepted by AT&T on March 20,2014.

Sometime later, AT&T decided to change the location of the tower from the original location. That change took effect after our HGWFNA meeting of April 17, 2014. A new submittal was processed on June 9, 2014. See Exhibit C for details

Representatives from AT&T/Lexcom presented information regarding the latest proposal. Much discussion took place. At one point Sharon Gretch of Lexcom asked for a show of hands by those opposed to the tower. All but three members of our neighborhood association raised their hands. Since our typical vote did not take place, we don't know if those three individuals want the tower, were abstaining or some in both categories. See Exhibit D for details

- ATT&T cell tower on McLoughlin school property is still a very controversial topic
 - o This has been a major topic since October of last year
 - o Unscheduled representatives from AT&T/Lexcom were given an opportunity to present their information.
 - Major concerns from neighbors in attendance
 - Radiation to young children (evidence was presented that no scientific evidence exists that RF radiation is NOT harmful and there is much indication that it may be for young people with naturally thinner skulls.)
 - Poor cell coverage for AT&T customers in a fairly large area in our neighborhood. One resident stated that their normal AT&T service is adequate but they have a problem making long distance calls with AT&T. Others stated they use other providers and are pleased with their service.
 - A smaller Light Radio cube alternative to a tower was shown. Lexcom was not aware of this better and less costly technology.
 - It was mentioned that some real estate experts, state that a cell tower in the neighborhood can typically result in a decrease in value of the nearby properties by as much as a 25%.

- Sharon Gretch asked for a show of hands of those opposed to the placement of a cell tower on the school grounds. Other than the two representative from Lexcom all but three individuals raised their hands.
- Lexcom representatives were asked if they had considered placing their antenna at fire station 17, The Oregon City Christian Church or The Oregon City Methodist Church. They responded they had not spoken to any of those entities.
- They were asked would it be possible to achieve their desired coverage by placing two smaller directional antennas one at the existing PGE tower and another, co-located at the American Towers location. This solution may be less costly than one new large tower structure. They responded they would need to check with the engineer.
- It was mentioned that some real estate experts, state that a cell tower in the neighborhood can typically result in a decrease in value of the nearby properties by as much as a 25%.





RE: Two requests regarding the proposed AT&T cell tower at McLoughlin Elementary School

1. It has been brought to my attention that the proposed *easement* in the AT&T application to the City has not complied with Oregon City Code of Ordinances, ZONING, Chapter 17.41, Tree Protection Standards

I request a tree removal and mitigation plan be developed by AT&T and the City for

<u>the proposed easement.</u> This includes mitigation of tree removal, and/or digging around the roots, of approximately 12 trees from South End Road to the proposed cell tower excavation site, as well as 6 trees on adjacent neighboring properties with root systems that extend to the easement.

The Oregon City School District has signed a contract with AT&T which includes two,10 foot wide easements. One easement is 552 feet in length for the proposed telco lines. The other is 460 feet in length proposed for power lines. Both easements run from South End Road to the proposed cell tower excavation site.

2. Also, it has been brought to my attention that there is a discrepancy between the AT&T application to the City and the AT&T contract with the Oregon City School District, as to the of the easement width. The City application specifies a 5 foot wide utility easement.* The school district lease agreement with AT&T specifies two, 10 foot wide easements for power and telco lines. Due to this discrepancy, <u>I request that the city compare these two documents and that AT&T submit a new or edited application in regard to power line and telco line easement widths.</u>
