1. Convene Work Session of the City Commission

Commission President Shaw called the meeting to order at 5:32 PM.

3. Discussion Item

3a. Development Code Amendments including Equitable Housing, LEG-18-00001 (No Verbal Public Comment)

Pete Walter, Planner, presented on the equitable housing project and other recommended changes to the Development Code. The proposed changes would amend, clarify, and remove select standards for multi-family and commercial development and would allow for an affordable housing density bonus. There would also be changes to the Master Plan/PUD chapter and the height standards in residential and mixed use zones. Standards would be added for mobile food carts, after hours parking lots, and transitional shelters. Bed and breakfast/accommodations would remain as conditional uses in all residential zones. He explained the amendments to the Historic Review Board appeal process and changes to the requirements for public and street trees, tree protection, Natural Resources Overlay District, land divisions, street design, property line adjustment and abandonment, definitions, administration and procedures. He then described the Planning Commission review of these changes, the ideas for future work outside of the scope of this project, and next steps.

The Commission asked clarifying questions about the proposed changes including

transitional shelters, getting more public involvement, height standards, food carts, density bonus, alleys, and implementation.
