1. Brief project description:

The car show was held on Saturday, September 14, 2013 in downtown Oregon City. Show cars were parked on Main Street from 7th Street to 10th Street and on 8th Street and 9th Street. Show cars were also parked in parking lots along Main Street as coordinated with downtown businesses. Despite the smaller area available for the show due to the re-opening of the Oregon City bridge, the number of show cars entered was only slightly smaller than in 2012.

2. Description of project accomplishments:

The 2013 Downtown Oregon City car show was a great success. A total of 285 show cars were registered for the event. Another 12 show cars were for exhibit only. An estimated 8000 plus spectators attended the event. 2,196 people rode the elevator on show day. Twenty downtown businesses participated in the "poker walk" where by car show participants visited each business to draw a card for a poker hand. Downtown merchants reported a stellar day of sales from car show participants and spectators. Restaurants and taverns had numerous customers all day and into the evening. Some businesses, such as the Ice House, had special "after show" events that continued the festivities.

3. Measures of performance (i.e. number of people served; effect of the project on tourism):

Partly due to the exceptional weather and also due to the extensive advertising, an estimated 8,000 people attended the car show. Show cars came from as far away as Sparks, Nevada. Of the 285 show cars registered, 89 came from Oregon City. The majority from outside Oregon City came from Milwaukie and Portland. However, more than ten cars came from Washington and more than twenty cars came from outside the Portland Metro area, as far away as Redmond, Aumsville and Pacific City, Oregon.

Many of the downtown merchants reported numerous visitors and substantial sales.

5. How were OCCIT grant funds spent?

The OCCIT grant funds were primarily spent in two areas: 1) advertising, and 2) production of the event on car show day.

\$1,898.06 was spent on advertising in local newspapers and magazines; printing of flyers, posters, and signs; and producing banners.

Production costs on the day of the show included street closure fee, traffic control plan and barricades, trophies and plaques, and crowd and traffic control by Oregon City reserve police officers for a total of \$3,101.94.

All costs above the \$5,000 of the grant were paid from the show proceeds and by Trick 'n Racy Cars.


