The visitor to Oregon City is very interested in seeing the real history in our town. The beginning of the history of Oregon began in Oregon City. The visitor is interested in seeing the place where many of the events took place. The William L. Holmes House and property tells the story of the beginnings of Oregon. The Holmes family hosted the newly appointed Territorial Governor of Oregon, General Joseph Lane, for an inaugural speech and community celebration.

The Holmes House and property give the visitor an authentic picture and appreciation of the history of Oregon City and the beginnings of Oregon.

The McLoughlin Memorial Association was established in 1909, by community members who were interested in saving the Dr. John McLoughlin House. The MMA consists of a 21 member Board of Trustees.
