

OCPW STREET DIVISION GRID RESPONSIBILITY GUIDELINES

Street Maintenance

- The Street Maintenance Program maintains City streets, retaining walls, guardrails, sidewalks, bridges, and curbs to ensure proper condition for vehicular and pedestrian traffic. The type of work performed includes pressure washing, pothole repairs, asphalt resurfacing, concrete curb/gutter, 135 miles of city owned sidewalk, retaining wall, and pavement repair. The City maintains approximately 130 centreline miles within Oregon City limits.

Traffic Paint & Sign

- The Traffic Paint and Sign Program is responsible for the installation, and maintenance of all regulatory, warning, guide, street name signs, end of road barricades, thermoplastic legends and long line striping pertaining to vehicular and pedestrian traffic control. All street signs are maintained in accordance with the State Traffic Manual and the Federal Manual for Uniform Traffic Control Devices. Curb painting and thermoplastic installation is completed with in-house staff and the long line striping is typically contracted to Clackamas County.

Street Tree Maintenance

- The Street Tree Maintenance Program is responsible for the structural appearance and maintenance of approximately 30,000 trees located within the public rights-of-way. Systematic trimming of City trees is performed on an as-needed basis. Additional responsibilities include removal of dead, diseased and hazardous trees, and planting of new trees. Trees adjacent to private property that need attention will be reported to the Code Enforcement Division. Street Division staff oversees an outside contractor who performs major grid trimming and other tree services.

Right of Way Clean-Up

- The Right-of-Way Clean-up and Spray Program is responsible for the elimination of weeds, volunteer trees, and other plants growing on over 1,125 miles of right-of-way area, parkways, and vacant city-owned property. Rodent and insect control is not included in this program.

Landscape Median Maintenance

- The Landscaped Median Maintenance Program is responsible for all landscape in medians and areas assigned, which include: Willamette Terrace, 7th St, Molalla Ave, Washington St, and Beavercreek Rd Corridors. These services are typically performed by a Contractor, and administered by City staff.

Traffic Signal & Street Light Maintenance

- The Traffic Signal and Street Light Maintenance Program is responsible for the installation and maintenance of all City-owned streetlights, and traffic signals. All City-owned street lights are maintained by City staff. All traffic signals are maintained in accordance with the State Maintenance Manual and the manufacturers' recommendations and contracted out to Clackamas County. This program includes routine maintenance of street light poles, traffic signals, traffic signal indicators, and vehicular and pedestrian detection devices. The program also provides extraordinary maintenance on an emergency basis to repair damaged traffic signal indications, poles downed or damaged, or malfunctioning traffic signals.

Street Sweeping

- The Street Sweeping Program is responsible for the removal of dirt, leaves, and debris from the City's residential, collector, and arterial streets. All streets are typically swept once every 2 months. The downtown business area is bordered by Main St from 99E to 15th St. and Railroad Ave. The downtown area is swept one time a week on Monday's and every other Friday.

Graffiti and Trash Removal

- The Graffiti and Trash Removal Program removes graffiti and trash from public structures and assets throughout the City of Oregon City. Graffiti will be photographed and turned in Oregon City Police Department prior to removal.
