



14th Street Storm Drain Improvements Project

The City of Oregon City is planning a storm drainage improvement project in your neighborhood during the summer of 2015.

The 14th Street Storm Drain Improvements Project will eliminate a storm drain outfall which has been causing erosion damage to property and the creek between 14th and 15th Streets. When complete, storm runoff from this neighborhood will be conveyed to an existing pipe network in Jackson Street, which discharges directly to the Willamette River.



The project will revise and expand the storm drain system in John Quincy Adams and 14th Streets using open-trench construction methods. There will be some local traffic disruption during the construction period, although every effort will be made to minimize inconvenience.

This project will help preserve the stability of property slopes and the health of the creek into the future by reducing erosion and stream incision. For project updates and additional background information, please see:

Project Construction Schedule:

- ◆ **Total Construction Period:** Construction is anticipated to begin July 1 and last 6—10 weeks.
- ◆ **Traffic Disruption:** Traffic disruption due to staging and open-cut pipe installation is expected to peak during the middle 4 weeks of construction, or approximately July 15—August 15, 2015.
