Disaster Declaration Process

- The City Commission has the **legal authority under Ordinance No. 03-1015** to declare that a local emergency exists.
- Who can make the Declaration
 - The Mayor
 - The City Commission President, when the Mayor is absent
 - The City Manager, when a quorum of commissioners cannot be assembled
 - The Police Chief or the Incident Commander (IC), if the City Manager is unable to act
- Declaration must include:
 - Description of the situation and existing conditions
 - Geographic boundaries affected
 - What special powers are being activated by the City
- If County, State, or Federal assistance is needed, it must also declare that all appropriate and available local resources have been expended and contain a request to the Governor for the type of assistance required.

Emergency Powers (Chapter 2.52 OR Code)

Allows for flexibility in managing resources under emergency conditions such as:

- Diverting funds and resources to emergency operations
- Authorizing implementation of local emergency plans and implementing extraordinary protective measures
- Resources from organizations and individuals initiated through mutual aid and cooperative assistance agreement
- Legal protection for actions initiated under emergency conditions.
- Requesting State and/or Federal assistance to augment local resources and capabilities.
- Raising public awareness and encouraging the community to become involved in protecting their resources.

Local Declaration of Emergency (City Commission)

County Declaration of Emergency (County Commission via County EOC)

State Declaration of Emergency (Governor's Office)

Federal Disaster Declaration (POTUS)

Disaster Declaration Process

- The City may choose to declare a local emergency even if the need for additional support or resources is not anticipated in order to implement provisions of the emergency code.
 - Enact a curfew
 - Suspend procurement requirements
 - Commit to mutual aid agreements
- The City's request for a declaration must be processed through Clackamas County Emergency Management to OEM. The request for a disaster declaration and assistance does not indicate the surrender of Command responsibility and authority.

Command Staff Responsibilities

Operations:

• Identify necessary resources and outline special powers needed to respond to the emergency. Assist in initial damage assessment.

Planning:

• Provide situation and resource summaries and initial and preliminary damage assessments.

Logistics:

• Compile resource requests.

Finance:

• Assist in preliminary damage assessment and coordinate damage survey activities.

Command:

• Present the declaration package to the City Manager and City Commission.

Emergency Acquisition of Resources

- During a declared emergency, authorized to extend government authority to non-governmental resources (e.g. personnel and equipment) that may support regular government forces during an emergency
- May **enter into agreements** with other public and private agencies for use of resources.
- The owner of the property shall be entitled to reasonable compensation.

Time Limit on Emergency Regulations

- The declaration of emergency shall become effective upon its issuance and dissemination to the public by appropriate news media.
- A declaration of emergency shall terminate 48 hours after its issuance, or upon the issuance of a declaration determining that an emergency no longer exists, whichever occurs first
- Commission may, by resolution, extend a proclamation of emergency for additional periods of time as determined necessary.
