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### CANEMAH NEIGHBORHOOD

The Canemah Historic District is located at the southwesterly edge of the city limits of Oregon City, on the southerly (rocky ledged) bank of the Willamette River, just above the Falls. The community lies within a crescent-shaped hollow in the basalt cliffs that rise to the south above the river. Its name is said to derive from a Native American word "kanim" for "canoe place" and it was the existence of a graveled beach that gave rise to the town's establishment in 1845. Because of the falls, cargo and passengers had to be portaged at this point. The views, topography, and history create a deep sense of place within this community. The "gateway" as you approach Canemah along 99E both from the northeast and southwest, are long steep cliffs of basalt rock, one's first exposure to the conditions of this place. The topography, geology and hydrology have created the uniqueness of this community in both positive and negative ways. Canemah is a historic landslide area. This knowledge is expressed through the widespread use of retaining walls (both basalt rock walls and concrete walls) throughout the entire neighborhood enabling the homes to be nestled up and down the hillside providing amazing views of the Willamette River and the Willamette Falls. These views have also given rise to the prevalence of first and second floor decks along with large window openings on the houses all along the hillside (both historic and non-historic). The retaining conditions have often been overgrown by ivy and moss making them less evident, creating a feeling of longevity and proof of the power of natural systems over man-made structures. To punctuate this message, as you walk through the neighborhood you hear the sound of running water cascading through the man made channels which are both beautiful and necessary to safely control the water flow of the hillside.










Bay of windows all along East facade of building turning the corner to the North of the building. This home has a many large window openings.
