Purpose of the Emergency Operations Plan:

- Provides framework for coordinated response and recovery activities during an emergency. (Identification of roles)
- Primarily applicable to extraordinary situations and is not intended for use in response to typical, day-to-day, emergency situations.
- Complements the Clackamas County EOP, the State of Oregon Emergency Management Plan, and the National Response Framework.
- It also identifies critical tasks needed to support a wide range of response activities.

Four Phases of Emergency Management:

- **Mitigation and Prevention:** To eliminate or reduce likelihood and/or consequences of hazards.
- **Preparedness:** To develop and enhance the response capabilities that will be needed in an emergency.
- **Response:** Emergency services during a crisis these activities seek to reduce casualties and damage and to speed recovery. (*Priority*: 1. lifesaving, 2. incident stabilization, 3. property conservation)
- **Recovery:** Both a long and short term process. Short term restores vital service to the community and to provide basic public needs. Long term focuses on getting the community back to normal.

Declaration Process:

- A declaration of emergency by the City is the first step in accessing State and Federal disaster assistance.
- The City Commission has the legal authority under Ordinance No. 03-1015 to declare a local emergency.
- If no quorum can be assembled due to absence or incapacity: City Manager, Police Chief, Incident Commander.
- Must Include: description of the situation and existing conditions, delineate the geographic boundaries affected, and outline what special powers are being activated. If requesting State/Federal help, must declare that all resources are expended and what assistance is required.

 - River Mill Dam (Estacada).
 - North Fork Dam and Faraday Diversion Dam, both southeast of Estacada.
 - Timothy Lake Dam (includes Harriet and Frog Lake Dams)
- Volunteer and Donation Management: OCPD Community Outreach.
- Removed Hazard Analysis Matrix
- Other incidental changes (names, roles, plan dispersion, etc.)
- Thumb drives vs hard copies.
