Building:

- -the letters for the TEEN section were installed and sit atop the curved shelf;
- -we had some problems with the north sliding doors earlier in the month; this is now fixed
- -the architects, contractor and project manager will be visiting to review the building for outstanding issues and doing the Warranty Walkthrough as the addition is one year old (July 27)!
- -the RFID self-checks will be installed on July 12 & 13; we are a beta site, so we get ours earlier than other libraries; the automated materials handlers have arrived in crates at NT and will be installed in August

Staff:

- -we are interviewing for two new positions, two 30 hour a week Library Assistant 2s, one each for YS and AS
- -we had a 2 hour staff training on security, which was very good

Stats:

- -again door count was over twice as much as it used to be and this month was almost 36,000 End of Year observations:
 - -February-June have all been over 30,000 door count
 - -since school has let out, we've had several days over 1500 door count
 - -new card registrations has increased greatly since the new addition opened
- -our collections have increased by almost 10,000 items in the last year. This will take a while to rebuild, even with the Foundation donation of \$50,000, but they are all newer and good quality as opposed to the collection we had at the Hilltop location
 - -deletions from the collection has
 - -circulation is creeping up; total circulation of items is 429,360 (last year 423,796)
- -the holds ratio is slowly flipping: we are sending many more items to other libraries (23K) and receiving far fewer (5K)
 - -reference questions have increased
- -cultural pass usage has increased by about the number which would go out in a typical month (30)
 - -internet use has increased by 4,000 sessions
 - -in-house volunteer hours has increased
 - -Library2Go as increased by almost 4000 downloads

Programs:

- -Summer Reading has been a huge success this year
- -the kick off Monday Fun Day with Touch a Truck was a lot of fun according to the people who were there
- -story times have started back up; World Story Time featuring French, Russian and Chinese has started up for the summer on Saturdays
