1. Call to Order

Chair Metson called the meeting to order at 6:00 PM.

3. Discussion Items:

PC 16-034 5th Avenue Gate Replacement- HRB concurrence request

Christina Robertson-Gardiner, Planner, said this was an application that needed HRB concurrence of a staff level approval of a proposed gate on 5th Avenue. The design guidelines did not give clear direction on this issue. The gate would be where 5th Avenue transitioned into the private Canemah Cemetery Road, however the gate was still on 5th Avenue right-of-way. There was an existing private gate that Metro, the Fire District, and Canemah Cemetery Association installed and the new gate would be pushed further back off of the right-of-way to keep people from informally parking there. The new gate would be four feet tall, metal, and would be a vehicular blocking fence. Staff thought if the fence was powder coated black or dark brown or green, it would blend in with the surroundings and be high quality. It would likely have to go before the City Commission for a permanent right-of-way obstruction permit.

Mr. Baysinger said the Canemah Neighborhood Association had seen this application and had no objection to it.

A motion was made by Mr. Baysinger, seconded by Ms. Met, to concur with staff's approval of the 5th Avenue gate with the findings attached in the memo. The motion carried by the following vote:

PC 16-035 CLG Grant Update
