McLOUGHLIN NEIGHBORHOOD ASSOCIATION RESOLUTION 2017-01

A RESOLUTION APPROVING A REQUEST FOR AN APPEAL FEE WAIVER

WHEREAS on March 2, 2017, the general membership of the McLoughlin Neighborhood Association (MNA) unanimously voted to submit a certain Application for Designation of Historic Landmarks regarding the Camp Adair buildings in Lower Waterboard Park;

WHEREAS on March 3, 2017, said application was submitted to the Oregon City Historic Review Board (HRB) and on March 23, 2017, City Planner Trevor Martin notified the MNA that the application was deemed complete;

WHEREAS on April 18, 2017, City Manager Tony Konkol issued letters to the MNA and the HRB, purporting to reject historic designation of the Camp Adair buildings under ORS 197.772(1);

WHEREAS on April 27, 2017, the Planning Division issued a letter to the MNA reiterating the City's position as reflected in Mr. Konkol's April 18th letters;

WHEREAS the MNA is pursuing an appeal of the above-described letters in an effort to obtain a full and fair hearing of the MNA's historic designation application under the applicable criteria;

WHEREAS, the elected members of the MNA Steering Committee desire to adopt the following resolution to approve a request for an appeal fee waiver:

IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED that the MNA will request an appeal fee waiver for any fees associated with appealing Mr. Konkol's April 18th letters, the Planning Division's April 27th letter, and any other adverse decision involving the MNA's Camp Adair buildings historic designation application. If any fee waiver request submitted pursuant to this Resolution is denied, the Treasurer is directed to pay the required fee amount.
