## Proposed Vision:

To promote literacy and learning, celebrate curiosity and diversity, and support transformation in thriving, safe, and inclusive spaces.

Oz commented that the use of the word *thriving* seemed odd when applied to *spaces*. *Thriving* should be applied to living things, not to a static space. So we agreed to look at this. Here's what we think:

1) First of all and respectfully, we challenge this. If you google 'thriving spaces', you will find that these two words are often found together. I liked the Feng Shui business that named itself, you guessed it, *Thriving Spaces*. So, whether thriving should modify spaces or not, it is a phrase in usage. Not that everything on the internet is correct...but it's in use; that is our only point;

2) Next, if you really don't like *thriving*, we suggest *activity-filled*, *bustling*, *healthy*, *or lively*. Are any of those words better? I think they more of less capture the same concept as thriving;

3) Finally, what if we dropped the word *thriving* all together and simply said *safe and inclusive spaces*?

Next, after agreeing that the Mission is a-ok, we looked at the Guiding Principles. Mostly, the group decided they liked them and that there wasn't a huge need to change them, but that a few concepts were missing. The group remembered the wonderful sign that we added to the entrance of the library (the language of which I sent you last week) and decided they would like to see those concepts incorporated.

So, Denise and I reviewed the guiding principles to determine which concepts might already be embedded in the guiding principles and which still needed to be added. Here is what we came up with:

- embrace new and innovative ways to adapt to the changing needs of the community it serves;
- form partnerships to advance these values.
