Whether you are an active get-out-into-nature sort of person or a more laid-back take it easy explorer - this Field Guide can help you create your own adventure.

THERE'S A LOT TO LEARN. LUCKILY THERE IS NO POP-QUIZ AT THE END.

FOUNDED IN 1829 by John McLoughlin (incorporated in 1844), as the capital of the Oregon Territory. As "the End of the Oregon Trail," Oregon City became the final destination for many early immigrants.

In the early days, residents got to the upper levels of town via 722 steps up the bluff. It soon became apparent that an easier way to Midtown was needed.

IN 1915, an original water-powered elevator was built out of steel and wood and took 3-5 minutes to ride. By 1924 it was upgraded to electricity and the ride improved to just 30 seconds.

IN 1955, the new elevator was built with 751 tons of concrete and steel. At 130 feet high it zips passengers up in ten seconds. The Oregon City Municipal Elevator continues to operate as the only 'vertical street' in North America.



- 3. Walk the Promenade to Willamette Falls
- **4.** Time Your Climb: Run the Grand Staircase up to Midtown
- 5. Kayak Launch & Activities at Clackamette Park
- 6. Run the Clackamette Cove Trail
- 7. Walk to the End of the Oregon Trail Visitor Center
- **8.** 'The Original Stash' (the First Geocαche) N 45° 17.460' W 122° 24.800'
- 9. Hike to 'Hidden Viewpoint'
- **10.** Singer Creek Park Disc Golf Course (bring your own disc)






Starting from the elevator, explore the unique history of one of the oldest cities west of the Mississippi. It's kind of like time travel.

- 6. Read the Historical Plaques on the Arch Bridge
- 7. View Gothic Revival Architecture Unitarian Church
- 8. Visit The Ermatinger House
- 9. Visit The Barclay House
- 10. Observe the Willamette Falls Mills & Powerplant

- 9. Experience the Willamette Falls Viewpoint
- 10. Take a Short Drive to the End of the Oregon Trail Visitor Center
