A RESOLUTION TO ALLOW PRIVATE UTILITY SERVICE LINES AS REVOCABLE LONG-TERM RIGHT-OF-WAY OBSTRUCTIONS AT TAX LOTS 3S-1E-01AA-02200, -03600, AND -03700, OREGON CITY, CLACKAMAS COUNTY, OREGON

WHEREAS, the multifamily development approved under City Land Use case file numbers SP 17-145 and US 17-09, known as "Canemah Cottages" ("PROPERTY"), adjoins two parcels which are divided by a section of unimproved right-of-way (see "Exhibit A - Site Plan"); and

WHEREAS, Public Works requires multifamily housing to be served by one private utility service line for each utility type (water, sanitary sewer, and storm sewer); and

WHEREAS, two of the five buildings that are part of the development are opposite a section of unimproved right-of-way (alley) from the public utility mains in Miller Street; and

WHEREAS, the developer proposes running the two individual private building utility service lines ("LINES") to Miller Street through the unimproved right-of-way; and

WHEREAS, Public Works requires the private utility services in the right-of-way to be constructed to Public Works Design Standards; and

WHEREAS, Public Works determined no adverse impacts to the right-of-way result; and

WHEREAS, a maintenance and release covenant has been executed for the LINES (see "Exhibit B - Covenant for Maintenance, Release and Indemnity"); and

WHEREAS, the Oregon City Municipal Code 12.04.120 requires that permanent obstructions in a public street (or alley) right-of-way be approved by the City Commission by passage of a resolution; and

WHEREAS, following passage of this resolution, Oregon City Public Works will issue a "Revocable Long-Term Right-of-Way Obstruction Permit," RWOBS-18-00019, which includes a covenant for maintenance of the WALL.

NOW, THEREFORE, OREGON CITY RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Authorize the City Engineer to issue a Revocable Long-Term Right-of-Way Obstruction permit, RWOBS-18-00028 for the design, construction, and maintenance of the LINES by the PROPERTY owner.

Section 2. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption by the City Commission.
