Construction Coming Early 2019


Project Overview

In January, ODOT will begin improvements to the OR 99E vehicle and pedestrian tunnels just south of downtown Oregon City.



Improvements

- Update lighting, fixtures and electrical systems to improve safety and visibility
- Install a variable message sign south of the tunnel to alert northbound drivers of traffic conditions



Improvements

Close left turn from OR 99E to Tumwater Drive to

- Reduce conflicts with future McLoughlin-to-Canemah Trail
- Improve safety and reduce conflicts with turning vehicles



Construction Coming Soon!



- Construction will begin in the next few weeks
- Most of construction will take place at night to minimize impacts to those using OR 99E
- Travelers can expect flaggers and delays most nights



Construction Impacts

- **Short-Term Full Closures:** Tunnel traffic may be restricted to 20-minute windows at night
- **Nighttime Single-Lane Closures:** Lane closures, including with flaggers directing traffic
- **Daytime Single-Lane Closures:** Possible single-lane closures weekdays 9 a.m. – 3 p.m.
- **People Walking & Biking:** Travelers can use pedestrian tunnel with minor delays



Nighttime Noise



- Residences and businesses adjacent to the project may experience some nighttime noise
- ODOT is securing the required noise variance and will minimize noise whenever possible
