Attached please find our application and 2 letters of support submitted for consideration for the Metro Community Enhancement Grants Program.

We are thrilled to share information with the Grants Committee about our Youth Stories for Change summer program, for which we are requesting funding. The program is in partnership with Clackamas County Juvenile Department, and with Clackamas Community College which donates their auditorium for us to use as classroom space, as well as a venue for our final public presentation. This year we are working with the youth referred to us through the Juvenile Department on telling their stories in video/film format.

We are always looking for new ways to engage youth and encourage creative exploration and expression, while encouraging deep self-examination and group work to encourage peer community building, understanding and empathy. Since 2011, CCAA has offered a Youth Theatre for Change summer program, providing youth with an opportunity to develop communication and teamwork skills, and learn to positively express themselves while bolstering protective factors. After assessment and feedback from our partner, the Juvenile Department, the program has been changed into Youth Stories for Change, which maintains the same team building and communication exercises, but focuses less on theater and more on enhancing the writing portion and incorporating video creation.

It is hoped that by utilizing a medium like video - to which they can directly relate - we will be better able to engage youth in creatively sharing their thoughts, experiences, challenges, and successes with their community. The program will culminate in a mini film festival to share the students' voices and hard work.

We are grateful for the Committee's consideration of this project for funding.
