5. Briefly describe the project for which you are requesting funds.

As a part of the South End Neighborhood, Redemption OC would like to enhance the street side of our property to show that we are an active and vital part of the development of our community. Our desire is to:

- upgrade current lighting on our sign to meet the current code guidelines, but also to soften the brightness for our neighbors.
- provide a curbside grassy area with a parklike setting in the center of our front lot. By planting City approved trees and curbing, this will cut down on, if not eliminate, the use of our grass area as an "off-road" playground for vehicles during the occasional snowstorm or heavy rains that cause muddy conditions.
- include a couple park benches to allow for neighbors and dog walkers to rest during their walks.
- concrete the area surrounding our sign and repurpose the river rock to the outer areas of our entrance.
- allocate our side yard for a community Garden. We would like to fence this area in and secure it as well as provide water and access for neighbors who might like to take advantage of the space for growing vegetables.

The parking lot needs recoating and restriping. This not only will provide clear marking for our ADA parking spaces but will also add a crisp appearance to the property. Our parking lot is used by both the City and the neighborhood for activities, such as sporting events held at Chapin Park and for National Night Out.

There are several community groups that utilize our facility to meet (Gleaners of Clackamas County and community Pastoral groups), as well as, three (3) different congregations.

6. Describe why this project was selected and the community need(s) to which it will respond.

As a church, we want to provide for our community. While we own our building and land, we don't have the resources or funds to provide a community appealing facility. We want to be successful in being a part of the community. In order to do that, we need to keep up appearances, as well as making a safe place for activities. We can offer a fabulous meeting place for community groups. But in order to draw the community to us, as with any business or storefront, we want to be attractive and inviting for the neighborhood and the City of Oregon City.

As a part of this project, we will be helping Adrian McLucas complete his "Eagle Scout" project. Adrian is an Oregon City High School student who is a Life Scout in Troop 140 and is very active in his scouting journey. We have been actively assisting him in fund raising for his project as well as assisting him to collect funds and donations of supplies from local businesses. Because the planting season is upon us, we have already begun his project.

Our community Garden will accomplish the task of supporting families, who may not have the space for a home garden and could benefit from growing their own produce. A community garden would provide a potential gathering place for people to meet and gather who have similar interests.

1. The grassy area in front of our property would be groomed and add a curb appeal for driving through the neighborhood. The provision of an area for dogs would limit the amount of pet waste left on properties belonging to our neighbors.

2. The low/self-watering system allows for trees to grow with less water pumped through our meters and the garden would rotate use of soil for seasonal vegetables.

3. The clean and crisp edges to the front of our property would increase the desirability of the properties that align with the front of the church. When people are looking to buy or build, they want to know that the neighbors are taking care of their property also, which maintains the property value in which they are wanting to invest. It will also encourage area homeowners to take pride in improving their properties.

4. There is an obvious benefit to Redemption OC should we receive grant dollars. We bought this property from a ministry that was struggling trying to build a residential facility. We paid cash and most likely more than it was worth. After purchasing the property, we invested all our savings in getting the building usable and up to code, including ADA compliant. Thus, leaving us without resources to complete the aesthetics part of the remodel. The enhancement of the outer perimeter of our property would be a huge "welcome mat" for our church. The ability to meet the needs of our community would increase the "value" of our property and make it visually desirable, which would increase church memberships, offer additional meeting places for weddings, education, community meeting center, etc.

6. We do let community groups/activities utilize our parking lot on many occasions. The Boy Scouts, Gleaners, Local Business strategy meetings, Narcotics Anonymous, 4-H and countless church events designed for community enrichment have used our facilities. We will continue with these *and* have a community garden as a place for neighbors to gather.

7. We can be a gathering place in time of emergencies and would like to provide warming in the winter and cooling in the summer.

9. As a church one of our core values is to provide excellence in training for people of all ages. We provide a place for that to take place. We have had and will continue to allow training for BSA and other groups as we are asked.

South End Neighborhood Association – Redemption OC, 405 Warner Parrot between Shenandoah and Birchwood.

10. How will the community benefit by your project? What is the estimated number of people affected and anticipated outcome(s)?

We hope to become a gathering place for our community. To allow for groups to use our property as a place that can be used not just for church, weddings and funerals, but to share lives in every season of life. This can be as simple as providing a bench to rest on when you walk your dog, a drink of water on a hot day or affordable alternatives for people that struggle to stay afloat.

Of course, our congregation benefits, but we only want to provide for our community. The only barrier sometimes is a warm and inviting doorway in which to walk through.

Recently, we have provided Trunk and Treat, Car washes, Harvest Festivals, VBS parties, Thanksgiving dinners, Christmas dinners and always try to include the community. We have access to a "Block Party Trailer" that includes bounce houses, popcorn and cotton candy machines and games that we can utilize as we need it, as we have done for National Night Out. Our property is the perfect place to hold these activities with the upgrades we are needing to make.

11. What community resources will be used as support for this project (i.e. community, cityowned property, city departments, transportation services or other civic groups)?

The Boy Scouts will be a huge resource for us as far as labor is concerned. Students and parents are providing tools, labor and equipment for this project. I anticipate that we will be using local tool rentals as well for the tools that we do not have provided by volunteers.

Our church, although we are small in numbers will dedicate hours and labor to this project to see it's completion by the anticipated date in October.

We have received bids from local contractors for the items that require professional and permitted items.

12. Briefly describe prior experience managing similar projects, including any past enhancement projects.

As the pastor of Redemption, I was a part of the purchase of this property 5 years ago and designed and implemented many of the reconstruction projects that came with the remodel. I have had to coordinate inspections and had to submit plans for changes in coordination with our contractor. That experience was difficult, but educational. Since that time the projects like upgrading fixtures to LED, pluming fixture repair, and most all upgrades, have been done by myself and a small group of people from our church. I have before and after pictures that tell the tale of an undaunting task completed by our little congregation. I can organize, lead, delegate and motivate individuals, while maintaining relationships with my parishioners to encourage and get them to work together as a family.

- The month of July, we will be scheduling the Community Garden surround and topsoil placement.
- The last week of July we will have our electrical contractor install the lighting for the sign.
- The first week of August we will be pouring all the concrete for curbs and sign frontage.
- The third week of August I hope to have the middle section of the front of our property complete with irrigation and grass.
- The first part of September we expect to have the parking lot resurfaced and striped.
- Our first community activity will be the end of October. Harvest Party and Open House.

The biggest measurement will be the dramatic differences of before and after. I will rely on the contractors to remain faithful to the dates and cost that they have already provided. I believe that a 10% change order limit will keep us on budget. We have selected an aggressive plan of attack because we know that in our area there is a limited amount of time for outdoor projects. We anticipate great cooperation with the Boy Scouts and the leadership that they provide. We have already established a good relationship with the contractors that we plan on using.

We will have a committee formed to make informed decisions about spending and budgetary restraints. This committee will consist of myself and at least 3 others from our church body.
