Attached herewith is our completed application for the Oregon City Community Enhancement Grant. The school district's proposal this year is to replace the chain link fencing at Barclay School, 817 12th Street, with steel fencing that has a wrought iron appearance. I think you are aware that the Historic Committee approved this steel substitution for wrought iron at its' meeting on September 25, 2018. A picture of our proposed fence material is attached to this grant application. At the Historic Committee meeting last September the district was only proposing to replace the fence on the western side of the building and re-install fence from the southwest corner to the northwest corner, however Historic Committee member Jon McLoughlin inquired about replacement of all of the chain link fence at the school. This proposal is to replace all of the perimeter chain link fence at the school.

There are two major reasons that make this project important and valuable to Oregon City. First, this will provide a more secure perimeter around the school, further enhancing the safety of the students in our Bridges to Independence program housed at Barclay. Secondly, this will enhance the historic appearance of Barclay school. These two project outcomes greatly benefit the Oregon City School District and its students, the Historic District and the City of Oregon City as a whole.

The estimated cost of the complete fencing project is estimated to be approximately \$100,000. In any event, the district understands that the maximum grant amount will be the lesser of 50% of the project cost or \$50,000. We will solicit at least three bids from qualified fencing contractors prior to beginning the project. The district is only requesting reimbursement for costs associated with the fencing contractor. No project management or other costs will be submitted for reimbursement by the Enhancement Grant.

5. Briefly describe the project for which you are requesting funds.

The grant funds will be used to help pay for fencing at Barclay School. The chain link fencing on 12th Street will be removed and replaced with new steel fencing designed to look like wrought iron fencing. The fencing will also be extended north to the old gymnasium in order to secure the property from the public park on the west. The use of the new steel fencing which is designed to look like wrought iron was approved by the Historic Review Committee at its meeting on September 25, 2018.

We believe this grant request meets the eligibility criteria and goals listed on page 2 of the Community Enhancement Program Application form because it is for a public school and because it meets Goal #3, increasing the attractiveness or market value of a residential area by restoring the fencing to be in keeping with the historic district guidelines.

Based on other proposals for this type of fencing the cost of this project, using the specified style of fence, is estimated to be approximately \$100,000. The district will solicit bids from at least three qualified fencing contractors prior to proceeding with the project. In any event, the district understands that the maximum grant amount will be the lesser of 50% of the cost or \$50,000.

This project was selected for the following reasons:

- It enhances the historic appearance of Barclay School;
- It increases the market value of residential properties in the neighborhood;
- It aligns with the goals of the historic district;
- It improves the safety of the students who attend Barclay School as part of the new Bridges to Independence program which relocated to Barclay in September 2018.
