National Night Out

End of the Oregon Trail Interpretive Center - 1726 Washington Street

National Night Out is an annual community-building campaign that promotes police-community partnerships and neighborhood camaraderie to make our neighborhoods safer, better places to live. National Night Out has been celebrated across North America on the first Tuesday of August since 1983. It's a day when people hold parties to strengthen community cohesiveness and crime resistance and get to know their neighbors and their local public safety officials. When neighbors get to know each other, they create a connected and safer community.

Courtesy of the City of Tigard, we will be utilizing a "Bicycle Safety" trailer. The trailer has the following equipment:

30 bikes: 5 with 20" wheels, 20 x 24", and 5 x 26" all with quick release levers on the seat post. There are also two smaller bikes that were donated by WashCo Bikes.

Helmets: 100 helmets in various sizes.

Cones and signs: 6" and 12" cones and an assortment of signs.

Providence Willamette Falls medical Center will have a booth fitting and selling helmets at a very reduced cost. [\$5 to \$10 dollars]. And will have "Healthier Kids" program handouts and "Stroke Awareness" pamphlets for adults.

Traffic Safety Supply Company is loaning us a demo Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacon [RRFB] for a display.

- Vance will arrive on site at 3:00 PM to unload the trailer and start setting up. Once unloaded, the truck and trailer will be moved into the main parking lot. A small course will be laid out in the circular paved area in front of the "Covered Wagon" building. [see map]

- Oregon City Police will be setting up booths along the paved path that leads to the interpretive center.
- Paula Pacholl with Providence will set up a booth next to the paved circular area where the bikes are located.
- **ASSISTANCE NEEDED:**
 1. Unloading the trailer.
 2. Setting up a course for bikes.
 3. Set up the RRFB display. [Vance]
 4. Assisting kids with helmet and bike fitment.
 5. Giving basic instruction to kids on how to ride the course.
 6. Answering questions from kids and adults and monitoring activities.
 7. Tear down and load the trailer.
