Urban Renewal Stakeholder Advisory Committee Draft: October 2, 2019

Objective: Goal 1 of the City's 2019-2021 Goals and Priorities includes the following:

Determine how to proceed with the Urban Renewal Program in Oregon City through further discussion with the Urban Renewal Commission and public outreach/input.

This proposal will create an Urban Renewal Stakeholder Advisory Committee that will be tasked with reviewing the existing Oregon City Urban Renewal Plan, engaging the community about Urban Renewal, addressing outstanding issues that are of concern with the existing plan and to make a recommendation to close or keep open the existing Downtown Urban Renewal District. If the recommendation is to keep the District open, proposed amendments to improve the District shall be forward to the Urban Renewal Commission for their consideration.

Stakeholder Advisory Committee

The Stakeholder Advisory Committee will be created to review the existing Urban Renewal Plan and, based on public input and Committee discussion, make a final recommendation to the Urban Renewal Commission concerning the closure of the District or keeping the District open. If the recommendation is to keep the District open, recommendations of potential changes and amendments shall be forwarded to the Urban Renewal Commission for their consideration. The Stakeholder Advisory Committee will take part in discussions about:

- Urban Renewal 101;
- Review of previous Urban Renewal projects in the City of Oregon City;
- Review of concerns with the existing District that has resulted in a lack of support;
- Community education, outreach, feedback and prioritization;
- Discussion about the impacts and benefits of the District and whether to close the District or keep the District open;
- Review of a project list, assets to the City, indebtedness and timeline of investments/closure;
- Determine the appropriate use of urban renewal funds;
- Identify any operational improvements; and
- Final discussion and recommendation to the Urban Renewal Commission concerning the status of the District.

Staff would recommend that a subcommittee of Urban Renewal Commission members (3 or less) be selected to work with staff to review the Stakeholder Advisory Committee applications. The subcommittee will make a recommendation of Stakeholder Committee members to the Urban Renewal Commission for consideration.

Public Input

The project will invite community members to share their thoughts on the use of Urban Renewal as a redevelopment tool and goals and benefits of potential urban renewal opportunities and projects in Oregon City. The Stakeholder Advisory Committee will review the information received from the public in formulating a recommendation to close or keep open the District and any operations changes. A preliminary project list will be created by the Stakeholder Advisory Committee and reviewed by the Urban Renewal Commission, which will be utilized in the public engagement process to prioritize projects within the district. Based on information from the public, additional projects that had not been identified could be added for consideration by the Stakeholder Advisory Committee.
