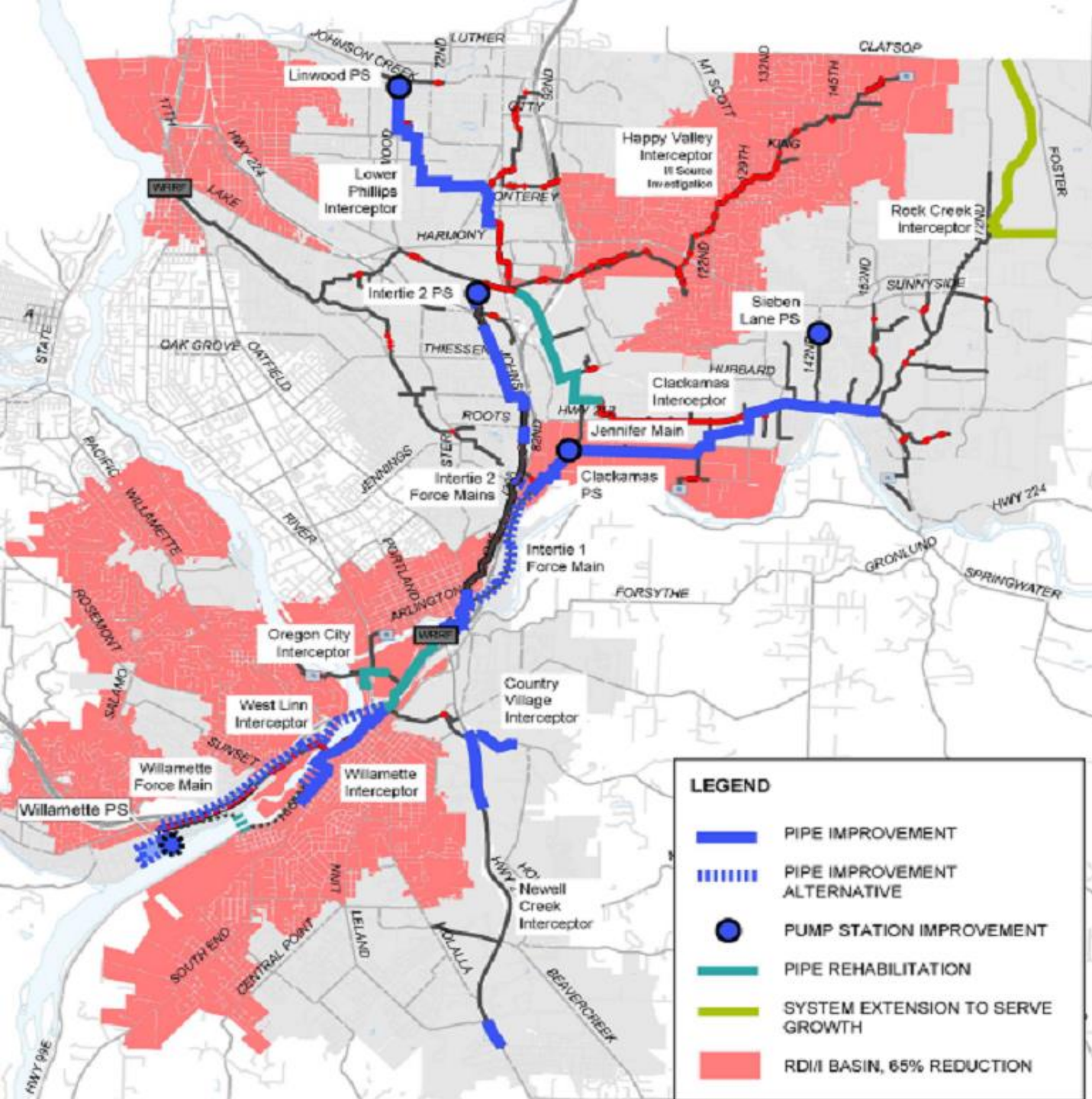

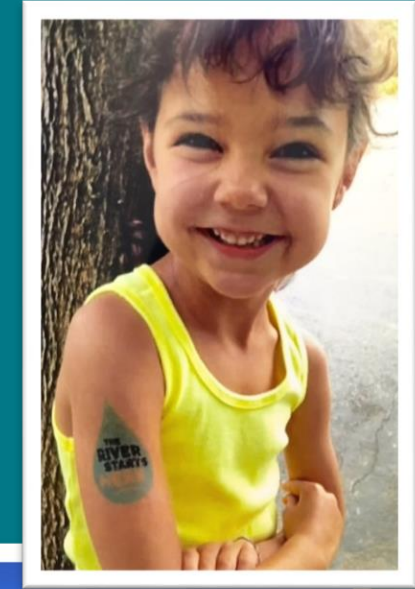

Tri City Good Neighbor Area

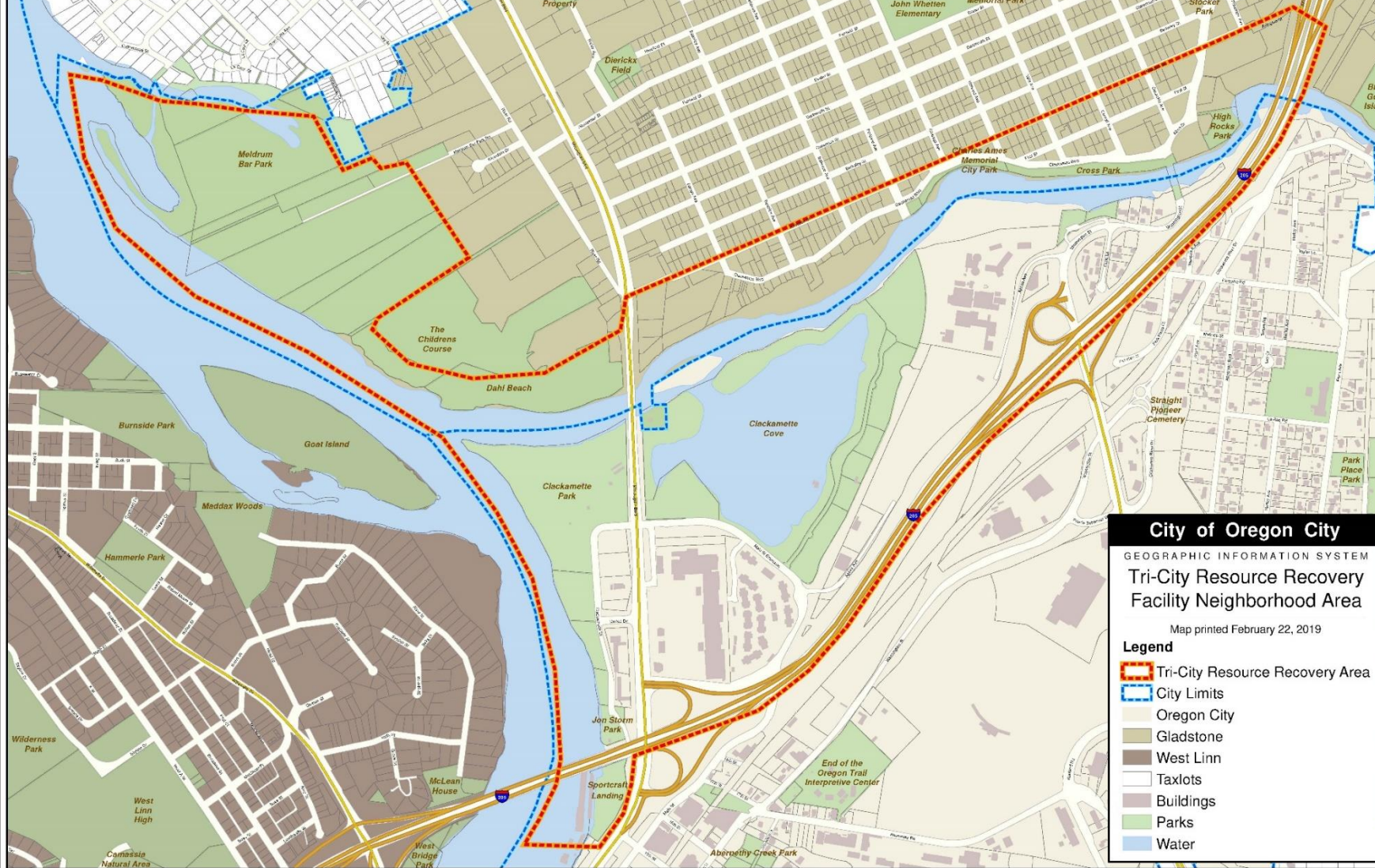

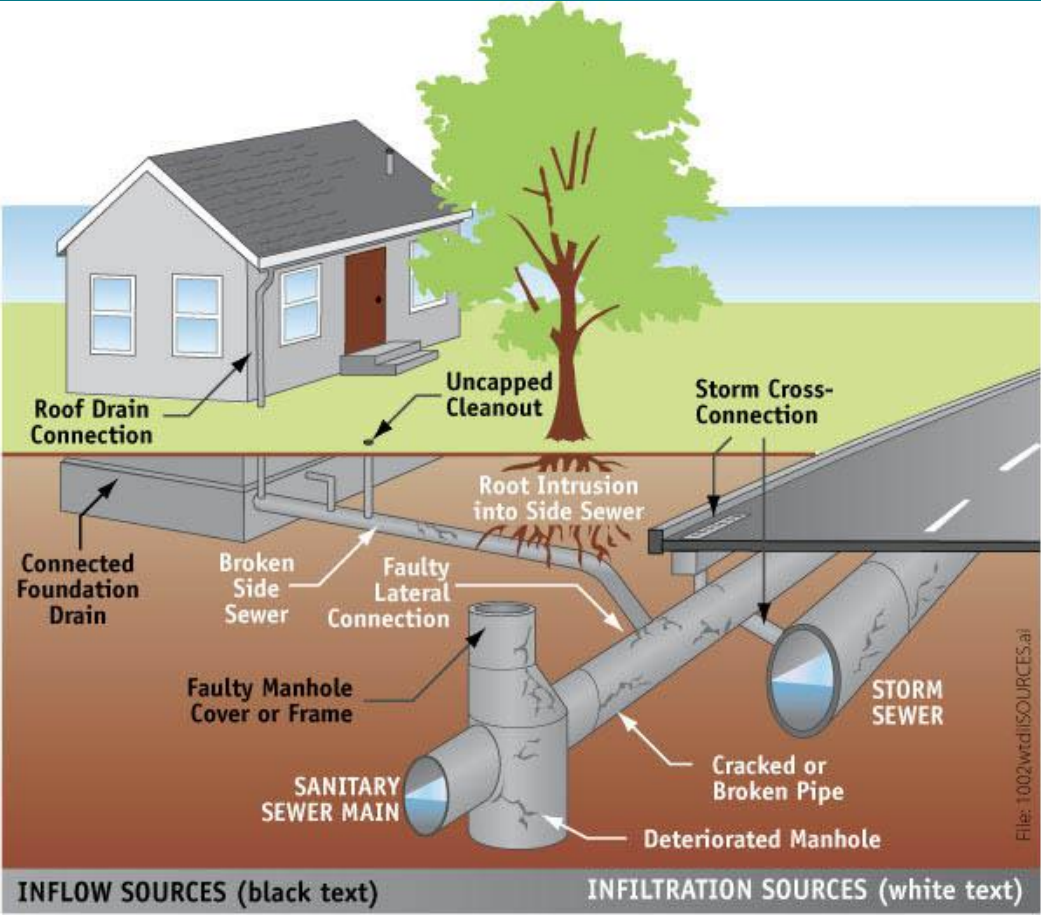

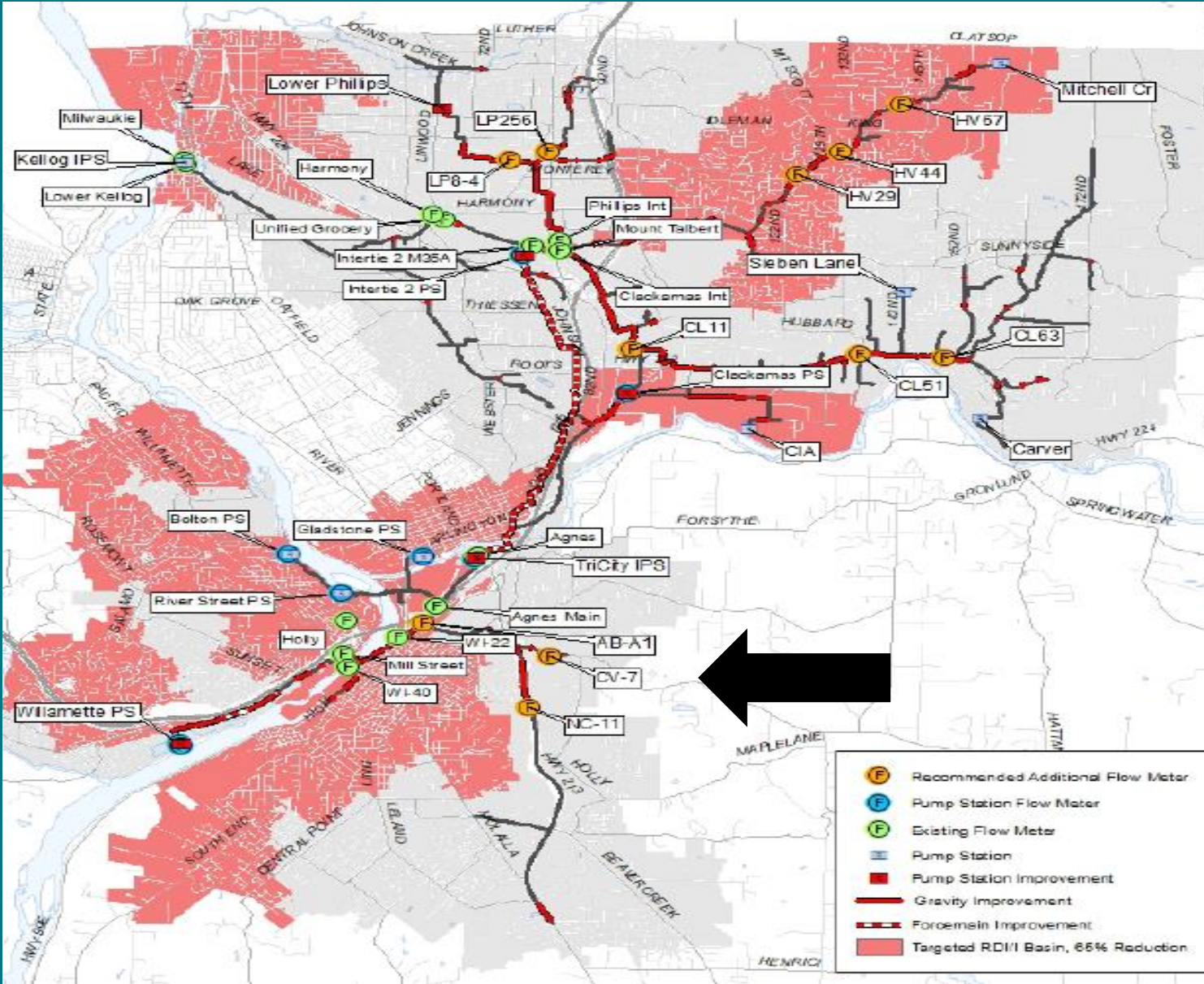
